UNRESTRICTED ENDOWMENT

The Foundation utilizes funds from its unrestricted endowment for a variety of needs associated with the College's mission. This endowment provides funds for faculty and staff development, assistance with the development of innovative instructional approaches including purchasing of pioneering instructional tools and equipment, and improvement of campus

facilities. Finally, funds are also utilized as matching dollars for grants received by the College which further enhance our educational capabilities. A gift to the Foundation's unrestricted endowment ensures that your donation has far-reaching impact providing for our students, faculty, staff, and regional workforce.

EITC

The Foundation acts as the administrator of the Educational Income Tax Credit program operated by the College. The Foundation receives donations from local businesses that assist in supporting the Accelerated College Education (ACE) program which allows high school juniors and seniors to earn college credits in advance of their high school graduation. These donations allow

the cost per credit for these courses to be greatly reduced, making this an affordable opportunity for students to experience college level classes while still in the comfortable surroundings of their high school classroom. Such innovative educational programs are just one of the benefits that a community college can provide to local students.

ONE BOOK PROGRAM

Pennsylvania Highlands Community College is proud to host the area's only One Book One Community program. The Foundation works with event coordinator Dr. Barbara Zaborowski to locate funding to support this very worthwhile project. More than 1500 students, teachers, and parents participated in the 2011 program, which was based on the Civil War. How dedicated is the College and Foundation to this

program? A significant amount of the donations received for this year's event were made by College employees and the College itself donated the use of its building and the volunteer time of over 40 College employees. Donors can direct their Annual Giving contribution to the One Book One Community program, supporting this worthwhile event.

SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENTS

Each year scholarships are awarded to deserving students who meet the guidelines of the endowed scholarships administered by the Foundation. Donors to the Foundation are free to make a pledge that adds to an already existing endowment fund or start one of their own. Pledges can be paid in

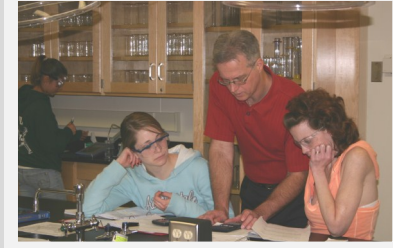

FOUNDATION'S STRATEGIC PLAN

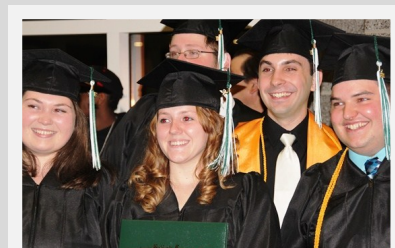

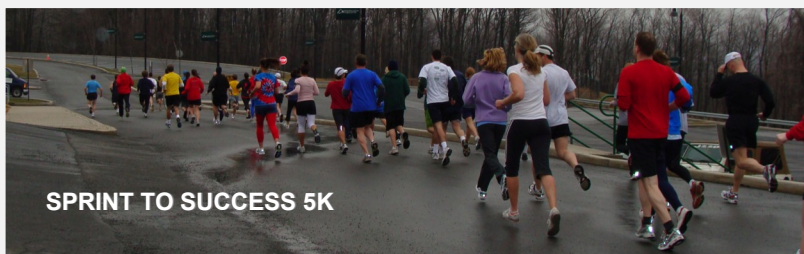

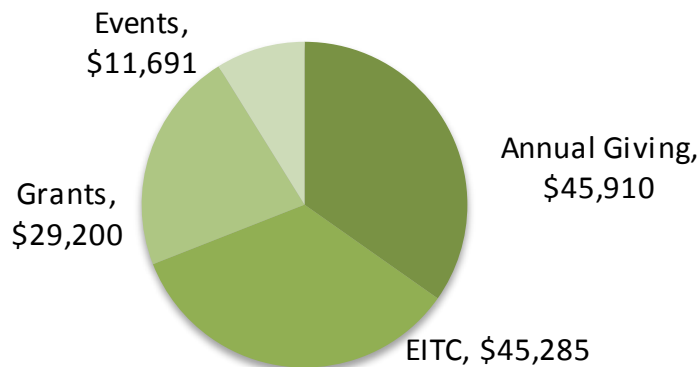
