

POLICE ACADEMY

Successfully completing the program awards cadets a certificate and qualifies graduates to apply for a Commonwealth Municipal Police Training (MPT) number, a prerequisite for all municipal police officers in Pennsylvania. Holding an MPT number is essential for securing employment in nearly all core and various related law enforcement positions.

Additionally, cadets will become eligible for a waiver certification for Act 235, qualifying them as armed security guards.
