Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA overall to graduate and a minimum of a 2.0 GPA in History every semester.

Students can satisfy EDG 4: Global and Regional Perspectives by fulfilling the Africa, Asia, and Latin America Major Requirement.

Students will have the option to select from several regions and courses to complete their History Concentration. Students must complete at least one course in all three of the following regions, with twelve of the total 18-hours at the 300 or 400 level.

- Take one History course in each geographical concentration area:
 - US, Europe, and Africa/ Asia/ Latin America
- Take three (3) additional History courses (no geographical req).
- 18 total credits-of which 12 credits must be at the 300/400 level.

*Student can select from the following while at PHCC. Based on the students' selection, they may need to work with their faculty advisor to adapt their selections listed in the above chart to ensure requirements are met.

- HIS 200 = HIST 2TC (U.S. Concentration; lower level)
- HIS 205 = HIST 2TC (U.S. Concentration; lower level)
- HIS 250 = HIST 2TC (U.S. Concentration; lower level)
- HIS 215 = HIST 375 (U.S. Concentration; upper-level)
- CIV 200 = HIST 201 (European Concentration; lower level)

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
